












EDITORIAL

Teaching French at the University of Guadalajara: the experience of Clarissa Guignard

Since she was a child Canadian volunteer, Clarissa Guignard (26) has known that she would one day work as a volunteer in a foreign country. As she grew older, she got interested to experience Latin America. Learning Spanish was the next step to reach her dream of living abroad. Supported by her Dad, a Spanish speaker, she progressed quickly.

Since the beginning of October 2014, she worked as a French teacher at our Teaching placement on the local university campus. She had the chance to grow professionally and obtain the necessary experience she needs to become a successful teacher back in Canada.

"All the students here are very enthusiastic about learning a foreign language and participate a lot during class. I play songs with them and organize small sketches to strengthen the language skills they have learned in class", says Clarissa who speaks passionately whenever she mentions her placement at the university.

Always with a smile on her face, it isn't hard to imagine that Clarissa has made lasting bonds with her students and colleagues. During her last days at the placement, the students and other colleagues invited her to visit different places in the city and its surroundings. For Clarissa this is a sign, showing that her work was successful as she got to make a real positive impact in people's lives: "Everyone has told me that they are going to miss me!"

On the 26th of November 2014, all the teachers and students of foreign languages (which included Korean, Chinese, English, German, Spanish, Italian, Japanese, Portuguese and of course French) got together to show how much they had learned in the previous semester: "The 'Linguafest' is a festival in which all students can show how much they have learned by performing sketches and showing videos or singing songs in the language they are learning".

"In the process of preparing for the 'Linguafest', teachers and students got to spend more time together, which helped reinforce the bonds between everyone", shares Clarissa and adds: "The idea of the festival is to show the relevance of learning other languages and how fun it is."

As Clarissa's time in Mexico comes to an end, she is looking forward to seeing her family again, but at the same time knows how much she will miss the experience she made in Mexico: "I know I will think about my Mexican family once I am back in Quebec. I will remember the people that I met here and all that I learned from the other teachers at the university".
